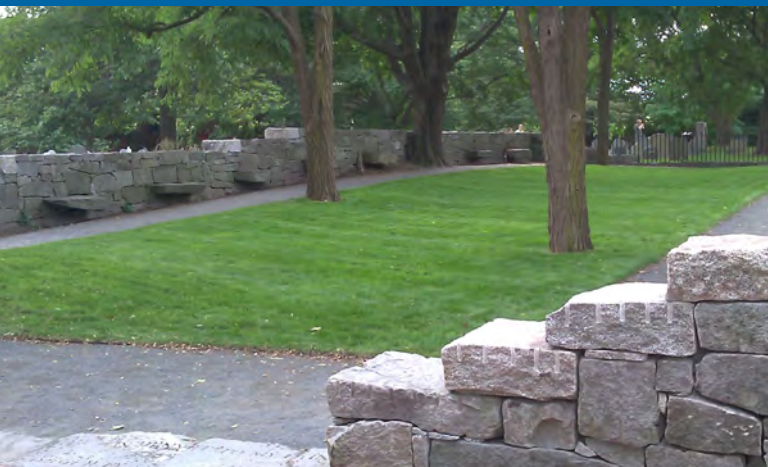


# *The Salem Witch Trials Memorial*

The Memorial is handicapped accessible and is appropriate for all ages.

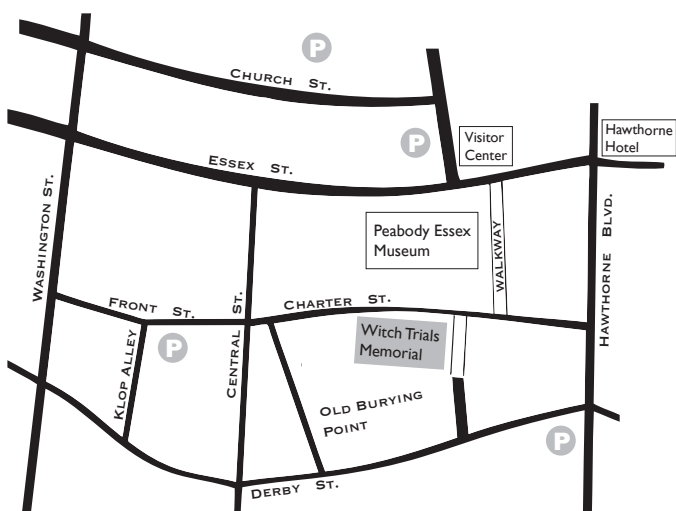


# Inspiring Courage to Confront Social Injustice
